Open-Ended Questions for Locating Information

Some of the questions below are closed-ended and some are open-ended. Read through them to see how patients are most likely to respond.

Closed-ended question: Do you know where ____ lives? **Response:** Yes.

Open-ended question: What is the address where ____ is living right now? **More helpful response:** 14th and Main Street.

Closed-ended question: Do you have the phone number where she may be reached? **Response:** I don't know.

Open-ended question: What is a phone number where she may be reached? **More helpful response:** 232-2233.

Closed-ended question: Can you tell me where he works?

Response: Maybe.

Open-ended question: What's the name of the place where he works?

More helpful response: George's Diner.

Check out the following examples of more open-ended questions for gathering locating information:

- "What is his cell phone?"
- "When is the best time to reach him/her?"
- "In what Internet chat room did you meet?"
- "At what clubs or places does s/he usually hang out?"
- "What is his/her email address?"
- "Who can get a message to this person?"
- "Where else could I find them/contact them?"
- "How do I get there? Give me directions."
- "What are the main cross streets?"
- "What are the landmarks?"
- "Which side of the street is it on?"
- "Where on the block is it?"
- "Which building in the complex?"
- "Which floor do they live on?"
- "What does the house look like?"
